Title	The Study on Municipal Schools ~A Case Study of Shiota-cho and Ureshino-cho Elementary School Union Municipal Okusano Elementary School~

Abstract	This study is on school unions, in which multiple municipalities form an administrative union to establish and operate schools. It was found that school unions began when several municipalities jointly established schools due to financial problems when elementary schools were established in each district by the "Elementary School Ordinance" of 1890. In 1953, there were 246 union elementary schools in Japan, but by 2023, there were only 11 schools in Japan as a result of the Showa and Heisei mergers, which led to the merger of many municipalities and a decrease in the number of municipalities. As a familiar example of a union school, we conducted a field survey of the Shiota-cho and Ureshino-cho Elementary School Union's Okusano Elementary School. When Shiota-cho merged with Kuma-mura and Gochoda-mura in 1956, a resident dispute arose from the residents of Ohkusano area who wanted to split the town and incorporate it into Ureshino-cho. The prefectural governor's conciliation proposal included a proposal to organize a partial administrative union to manage and operate the elementary school as an elementary school union elementary school, and the dispute was resolved. In 2006, Ureshino City was established and the school union was dissolved.
