Title	The formative years of Fumio Miura's Social Welfare Theory

Abstract	The late Fumio Miura (1928-2015) was a leading scholar in the study of social welfare Japan. He was also known as the translator of Richard Titmuss's "Commitment to Welfare". This article focused on the formative years of his social welfare theory. Miura's appointment to the Social Development Research Institute (SDRI) in 1965 as a researcher was the starting point of his research into social welfare. The institute was the Japan's first government backed institution to study social problems from the perspectives of social development, social policy and administration. He thus moved into a field which was new to him: that of social welfare policy. During his years at the SDRI, Fumio Miura published widely, his publications spanning such diverse subjects as the principles of social welfare; social change and social welfare policy; social welfare management; welfare delivery systems; community care; and citizens' participation in welfare activities in the community. He also played a significant role in establishing and developing social welfare policy and administration as academic subjects in Japan through those publications. Miura's work expanded to include active involvement in a number of central and local government advisory and planning committees, and he was influential in the planning and reform of welfare systems. His thinking and writing helped to shape the universal community-based welfare system in Japan.
