Abstract Abstract am liv. eld [1 spo chr wh [1 res am mu inf wh an hig [0 with coh eff	[Purpose] We aimed to clarify the relationship between feelings of loneliness and the level of self-care agency in elderly people with a chronic illness who ve alone, and to identify factors influencing the level of self-care agency in derly people. [Method] We conducted an investigation via an online questionnaire. Two pecific groups were selected as subjects: people aged 65 years or older with a nronic illness who live alone, and people aged 65 or over with a chronic illness ho live with one or more cohabitants. [Results] 104 responses were collected from each group for a total of 208 esponses. The mean age of respondents was 71.3±SD 5.4 years, and 154 espondents (74.0%) were male. Household income was significantly higher mong respondents living with one or more cohabitants. We carried out uultiple regression analysis on collected data to investigate factors ifluencing self-care agency in both groups. Results showed that among those ho live alone, strong feelings of loneliness, low levels of subjective health and a lack of hobbies tended to raise it. [Conclusion] Feelings of loneliness tended to adversely affect elderly people ith a chronic illness who live alone more than those who live with at least one obabitant. This suggests that offering support to prevent loneliness is an ifective method of maintaining a decent level of self-care agency among derly people with a chronic illness who live alone.
