Title	Changes in How Care Is Viewed through Literary Works: Rethinking Socialization of Care
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Abstract	<p>This study examined changes in how society views "aging, disease, dementia, and the support for people with these conditions" through the expansion of nursing care services by analyzing literary works (novels). As a result of a review of novels focusing on the character or narrator telling the story, and how each work gives a picture of nursing care, dementia, and other elements, we found that novels released in recent years include the perspective of sons of parents who need care in addition to daughters' or grandchildren's viewpoints, which suggests that the idea that "nursing care is women's work" is changing. In addition, some novels written from the point of view of an individual with dementia not only explore difficulties concerning dementia but focus on "life stories." For stories told from a son's point of view, an important theme is how to face "one's own conflicts and meaning of existence as the closest person to the elderly parent or parent with dementia," rather than the "difficulties and challenges of nursing care." It appears that the expansion of care services and increased male involvement may change perceptions about caring.</p>
