Abstract	This study examined the actual situation of HTVL-1 carriers (carriers) in the Kansai region and their support needs from the perspective of the persons concerned and their families and bereaved families. The method was to conduct a questionnaire survey of 120 people who were being followed at an outpatient carrier clinic, focusing on how they learned that they were carriers and their health-related quality of life (HRQOL). In addition, focus group interviews were conducted with a total of 7 carriers and family members living in Kansai and patients, family members, and survivors of patients with HTLV-1-related diseases, and responses were sought on the subject of "expectations for career support and future policies. A total of 53 respondents (8 males and 45 females) responded to the questionnaire. The most common reason for learning that they were carriers was "notification after blood donation" (approximately 50%), followed by "pregnancy checkup" (approximately 30%) and "results of blood test at hospital" (approximately 20%). The scores for [physical pain], [overall sense of health], [vitality], and [mental health] were significantly lower for women under 50 years of age compared to women over 50 years of age and the national norm. Based on the interview results, expectations for career support and future policies were broadly divided into four categories, broken down into "publicizing career support self-help group (career association) activities," "treatment and medical information," "securing funding for activities," and "support for patients and families with career and related illnesses. Based on the results of the interviews, we also reported on the support we provided to the Career Association.
