Title	Survey of Actual Conditions and Comparison by Severity of Illness in Outpatient Memory Loss
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Abstract	The purpose of this study was to investigate the use of an outpatient memory loss clinic by elderly patients and their families who visited the outpatient memory loss clinic. The most common reasons for visiting an outpatient memory loss clinic were worsening BPSD and memory loss. The most common requests from family members were "confirmation of diagnosis," "response to symptoms," and "advice. Next, the CDR showed high relevance in the correlation analysis of the brief assessment, indicating that it is highly useful as a screening test in outpatient memory loss clinics. Furthermore, the subjects were classified by severity of illness, and the sub-items of the BPSD evaluation (DBD13) were compared. The results showed that "asking the same thing over and over," "making false accusations," and "sleeping all day" tended to be more common in the group with moderately severe symptoms than in the group with mild symptoms. These results indicate that professionals such as occupational therapists should intervene at outpatient memory loss clinics to address symptoms and provide advice on how to spend time during the day.
