Title	The Suffering from a Lack of Hands in Medical Care and Nursing
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Abstract	As the number of elderly people requiring nursing care and support peaks in 2025, the biggest challenge is to secure nursing care workers. The Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare (MHLW) has implemented a variety of measures to date, including not only raising the wages of nursing care workers, but also recruiting and training a diverse workforce, preventing nursing care workers from leaving their jobs, promoting retention and improving productivity, making the nursing care profession more attractive, and accepting foreign care workers. Indeed, although the number of care workers themselves has been gradually increasing, it has not kept pace with the increase in the number of elderly people requiring nursing care. When the long-term care insurance system was launched in 2000, it got off to a mostly smooth start, partly because the number of elderly persons requiring long-term care was not so large. However, the situation is tightening precisely now as we enter a hyper-aged society. Unlike income security, long-term care services are services that cannot be provided without both the physical and human facilities to provide the services. Under the Corona disaster, the shortage of nursing care personnel has become even more serious. It is imperative that the government implement effective and concrete measures to secure nursing care personnel that will show steady results.
